

## Anticipation: Preparing for the King - the HOPE candle

- Typically, Christians will light 4 candles during advent in their churches and in their homes as we approach Christmas. Many Christians associate these candles with Love, Peace, Joy, and Hope as we add a candle each week as a sign of our growing anticipation. This year we're going to focus first on HOPE as it relates to our anticipation and preparation.
- **P** We light the candle of HOPE today, as we prepare for and anticipate the King.
- "And now, O Lord, for what do I wait? My hope is in you." (Psalm 39:7)
- P "Hope does not put us to shame, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit who has been given to us." (Romans 5:5)
- "Let us hold fast the confession of our hope without wavering, for he who promised is faithful." (Hebrews 10:23)
- "Rejoice in hope, be patient in tribulation, be constant in prayer." (Romans 12:12). "May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, so that by the power of the Holy Spirit you may abound in hope." (Romans 15:13)




## Confession and Absolution


- In the name of the Father and of the → Son and of the Holy Spirit.



#### Nicene Creed




- 5 The veil is torn, our Priest we see, As at the rail on bended knee Our hungry mouths from Him receive The bread of immortality.




### **Post-Communion Collect**
